I believe we both agree that the button-down shirt I chose reminds us of, “Prince, and if he were to have his own universe — the shirt is how his skies would look.” Tesfa loved the shirt so much that

he ended up purchasing it after the interview. The wing tip shoe was a nice new fit for him along with those old bootcut Wrangler jeans. The icing on the cake, and as I was saying about keeping “his soulful hip-hop identity in tact,” was that purple bandana, which (bandanas are something) he is known for wearing. And oh yeah, he ended up buying it as well.

"I'm the mascot for the greatest group of people!" Cody Bean of Viking Productions reciprocates the love from the crowd with a raspy voice at the end of the Eighth Hometeam New Years Rally. Once again, he and his team have thrown one hell of a party. I arrive to the get-down on Friday in the early evening and drive through the muddy, soggy ground to my camping spot. Lucky to find a bit of high ground next to a tree, I set up my tent and belongings while listening to **Bonnie Blue** play their Southern rock. Maddox Ranch is a beautiful property with sprawling fields and great shade for camping around their old wooden stage. I love that they have some outdoor showers so I can gaze at the stars while I scrub. After unpacking and meeting new friends, I head out to explore this boutique music festival. The Rally features 22 bands, four stages, a selection of food vendors, and clothing outlets.

The first music of the weekend for me is **Anthill Cinema** (formerly The Difference). They are an experimental fusion seven-piece from St. Petersburg, Fla. It really means that they touch on all kinds of genres. This set includes flares of hip-hop and even has some thrashing rock moments. They entertain the growing crowd while fire spinners light up the left side of the stage. No matter the style, these guys rock out! Check out their "Pop Song:"

When **Ajeva** plays, I make sure I'm there. Recently dropping their self-titled album 'Ajeva' in early October, 2019. Their lead singer, Reed Skahill is dressed in all black and brings all kinds of energy to the stage. He sings their soulful jam music which is sometimes electronic, other times jazzy, or a bit rockin'. They perform great tunes like "Off the Mountain," "Something Else," and "Funky Green Men." Michael Nivens scores a touchdown with his solos and noodling by weaving through and around his band like a streaking running back navigating the defense. They close down the main stage with style, leaving me wanting more.

The late night shows include sounds from **Free Range Strange**, a bluegrass jam band that centers around the power duo of Sunny Rae (vocals, ukulele) and Timber (guitar, mandolin, vocals). These two and their band play rowdy covers, including a nod to Eric Clapton with "After Midnight." But at the same time, the festival has a second late-night stage going with Tony Tyler (guitar) of **Comeback Alice** hosting an all-star session.

SATURDAY

Waking up on Saturday I survey the swamp ground around us. Mud and puddles are everywhere as people tip-toe through the mess to get where they're going. There is still a dry patch of ground between my camp and the stages, so I get ready and head down to the music. **Somatic** is the first set of the day. They are a serious collection of talent that's from the blues side of town. Today they are so light at fluffy as I walk up to the set with Stephanie Perez and Max Kipnis providing jazzy guitars. Sean Hartley's bass is soft and fuzzy while Cody Moore on sax/keys sprinkles in droplets funk—perfect for this slow and soggy morning. They cover Queens of the Stone Age "Make It Wit Chu" where Perez rips a lengthy solo with poise. Shredding on her ax, she fills Maddox Ranch with remarkable soul and power. Later in the set, Jamal Wright (drums, Holey Miss Moley) and Hartley pair up and take on Vulfpeck's "Beastly" with skill and precision.

Guavatron from West Palm Beach, Fla. is badass. They are so much fun to dance to! Conor Crookham (bass) seems to shoulder the biggest workload as this party pops off. His plush, heavy tone is dreamy all set long. They sit in the pocket so well, with little flares and changes to the steady cycle. The sun has begun to set and the lights on stage make the stage and band illuminate with fresh colors. The lights move to just behind the band, providing silhouettes and sounds that are more than impressive. The Guava Train keeps on rollin' as the band never stops playing during their two hour set. "Jam>Awake>Spring Roll>Jam>Xilla>All Systems Go>Ray Gun." Adonis Frangiskakis brings the grooves on guitar while Casey Luden (Drums / Vocals) and Rodney Hansen (Keyboards) round out this band on the rise.

Following their set and the end of the rain, **Cope** takes the stage to once again wow the crowd and show why they are St. Pete/Tampa's premiere jam band. I brought my dancin' shoes for this party! They entertain the crowd with funk, jam, and rock. The star of the show tonight is Juanjamon. He dazzles with keys and sax solos that are more than impressive. Each song he takes to the next level with his elevated playing. Every now and then lead guitarist Dennis Stadelman would take over for a short but intense solo. They come out of a jam back to the structure of the song and the crowd goes nuts! Just then, glowing jellyfish on poles appear above the crowd, dancing and floating to the music. They invite up Sean Maloney of Legacy Orchestra Collective to sing during "Going Home." Their clean transitions and bubbly songs have the crowd worked into a full lather when they play their biggest song, "Shake It." **Roosevelt Collier** has since joined the party and brings his electric slide guitar for a spin. The set ends with a birthday celebration for bassist extraordinaire Kenny Stadelman. Some lovely ladies present him with a cake and we all hoot and holler. **After all, this IS a family affair.** After the music we have fun with our friends in the dark, bouncing from campsite to campsite.



SUNDAY

After sleeping for a little while (I did sleep...didn't I?), **Este Loves** is the first band of the day and they serenade me while I struggle to take on the day. Weather conditions are improving: the ground is drying up and the sun is shining. They cover "Crazy" by Gnarls Barkley as well as some other lovely songs on this breezy afternoon. I'm not planning on leaving camp anytime soon, but the next band, **Golden Era**, starts their set with a cover of Eminem's "Drug Ballad." This song/artist is a favorite of mine and I have never heard this track performed live. I hustle to get my socks and shoes on, grab a bag of Doritos, and skip down to the front of the stage where Nook Nguyen dominates the lyrics and Michelle Caudle sings backup vocals. Whoaaa So good! They play another cool song called "Vietnam on Acid," that blows my mind. Rockin' with an anarchist vibe, it sounds like a Rage Against the Machine song. They continue with a cover of "Juicy" by Notorious B.I.G. but twist it to be their own halfway through, changing the instrumental track to fit their style while still rippin' the lyrics over top. Artist at large, **Matt Lapham**, comes out to help with the Warren G. & Nate Dogg's "Regulators."

Holey Miss Moley bring the funk for the final set on the main stage. They have a round of sit-ins with Matt Lapham, Stephanie Perez and Dan from The Reality contribute to the big sound on stage. Christian Ryan lets loose a lengthy sax solo on a salsa number and the crowd loves it! People grab their dance partner and begin dancing to this spicy Spanish tune. Suddenly, Dennis Stadelman from Cope comes on stage and peppers in a short but strong solo on guitar. Then he exits as quickly as he appeared. They continue the set with cover of Orgone's "Don't Stop" on the way to Cody Bean the Viking taking the stage to tell the crowd how much they mean to him. He gives his emotions to the crowd and they do a fake NYE countdown that ends with the band playing "We Are Family," "Do It Like You Do," by Lettuce, and a Parliament Funkadelic song. What a set!

From here we get a few hours of the St. Pete. string sensation, **Tire Fire**. Led by supreme guitarist Critter, they play for the remaining Rally fans. Later in the evening, all of the best guitarists of the weekend congregated for one last campfire set. Artists join and drop out like popcorn cooking over a fire. You never know who will walk up and join in the fun. Although we have to trek across the muck and mire to get there, the jams are great, and the festival organizers show up the music with a fresh keg to keep the party going all night.

I had a great time at Hometeam New Years Rally once again and can't wait to see what unfolds for this perfectly-small festival. Just remember, your New Year's Resolution doesn't start until you take down your Christmas decorations.

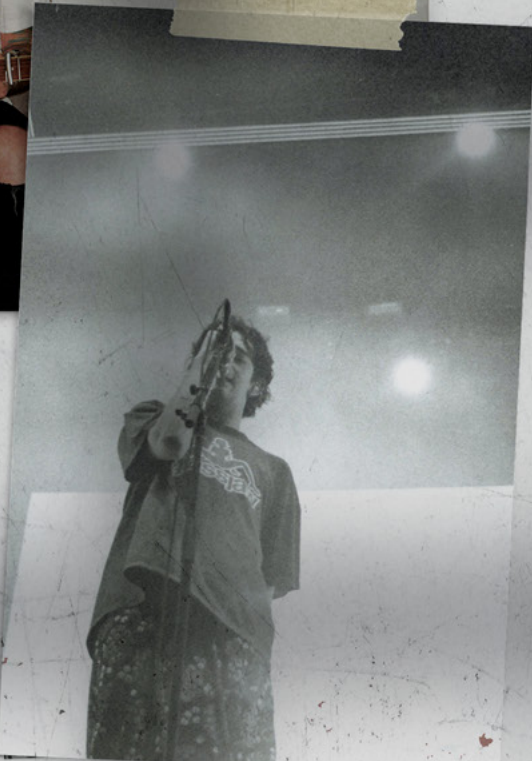
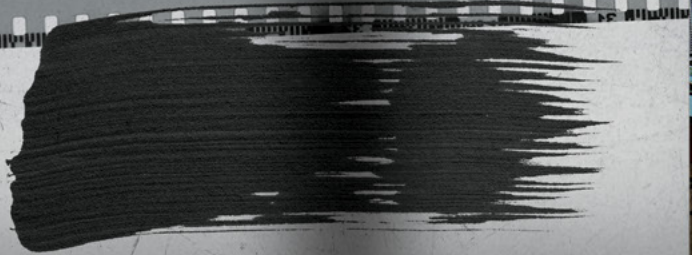

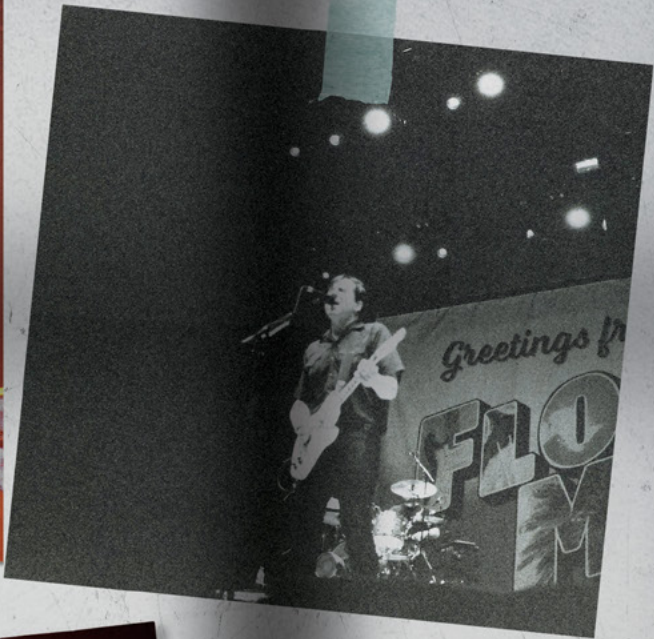

In the meantime, I'll be streaming their album to cope with the fact that I already miss hearing the songs live every night. METAL STORIES FOR METAL HEADS

METALLICA

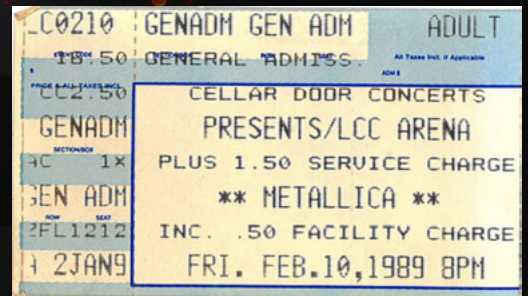
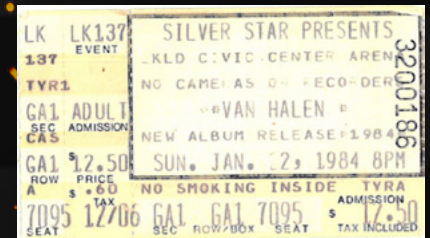
I can pinpoint the day my life changed forever — hearing Metallica for the first time. It's 1984 and I'm a musically impressionable 14-year-old whose only real outlet for new music is the radio (and whatever my friends were listening to). I went to my first concert — Van Halen — and a few months later my second show was Ozzy Osbourne and Mötley Crüe. Later the same year, after turning 15, my friends and I went to see RATT open for Billy Squire and then Dokken opening for Ronnie James Dio. My first calendar year of concerts was pretty well stacked with the heavyweights of hard rock at the time, but little did I know that in the not-too-distant future I would get a job as a prep cook in a seafood restaurant and meet a dude nicknamed "Captain" who would set me down the path to become the metalhead that I am today.

The day is March 3, 1986. It's freaking pouring at night when I get off work at the restaurant. One of the "older" dudes I worked with (Captain — was probably like 25, 30 at most) offers me a ride home so I'm not riding my bike home in the rain. As soon as we got in the car he sparks up a fat joint and asks if I knew Metallica had released their new album today? He says he stopped off to get it before coming in to work today and did not have a chance to listen to it on the way in. I tell him I've heard of them but have never listened to any of their music.

I learned of Metallica from reading the various music magazines I had, some of which I had the centerfolds of affixed to my bedroom walls. Receiving absolutely zero radio airplay back in those days, the band slipped through the cracks and neither I nor my friends had listened to them yet. Looking back on it, I guess it had to be a combination of my lack of funds and thinking that, by the look of the band members in the magazines, they were probably too heavy for my taste. Also, prior to the seafood restaurant job my only source of funds for cassettes and concert tickets was mowing yards. When I went to the local record store, 99% of the time I already had an intended purchase in mind.

Damn, was I wrong. Captain opens the cassette from its wrapper and pops it into the tape deck. Metallica's 'Master of Puppets' release starts playing the soft, inviting sounds of an acoustic guitar plucking with what I have always associated as a matador-style flamenco/Spanish sound. Just as those first few tokes were gripping hold of the relaxation sensory nerves in my brain, "Battery" rips away from the acoustic guitar and just absolutely shreds my ears with such a wall of sound that I immediately instinctively start nodding my head up and down. Holy shit this is freaking awesome!

I did not live very far away from work, so I only made it about halfway through the second (and title) track before we got to my house. Captain could tell that I was definitely digging the sound and since he had the new cassette to listen to he let me borrow Metallica's previous release, 'Ride the Lightning'. Quite high from the ride home I remember cleaning up from work, sitting down to listen, and being just totally blown away by what I was hearing. I brought it with me the next morning when my buddy Timbro came over and picked me up for school. As soon as school got out, Timbro and I went straight to the record store and got our hands on every Metallica release we could.



After digesting as much Metallica as we possibly could over the next few weeks, Timbro picked me up one day for the beach and popped in a Slayer cassette. Holy fucking moly, it was metalhead game on from there on out. 1986 turned out to be quite a glorious year to find my way down the path to become the Chief Metal Officer (of hornsraised.com and showsgoto.com) I am today. In addition to 'Master of Puppets', two other thrash metal genre defining albums were released with Slayer's 'Reign in Blood' and Megadeth's 'Peace Sells... but Who's Buying?'. I literally wore out the cassette I had of 'Reign in Blood' and ended up replacing all three of those cassette purchases with the CD versions.

1988 brought us to our first time seeing Metallica live. Now all these years later, I have seen Metallica eight times in seven different cities across four states. Throughout the years I have always professed that 'Master of Puppets' is one of the defining albums of my—and the thrash metal—generation. Still to this day I hold their first four albums in the highest regard. But, in full disclaimer here, '...And Justice for All' has evolved to be my all-time front to back favorite release from Metallica.

Looking forward to seeing Metallica four more times this year — on May 1 and May 3 at Epicentre Festival 2020 in Concord, North Carolina, and May 8 and **May 10 at Welcome To Rockville Festival 2020 in Daytona Beach, Florida.**

P.s. To this day I still do not know the Captain's real name, but wherever he may be today, Captain, I salute you!

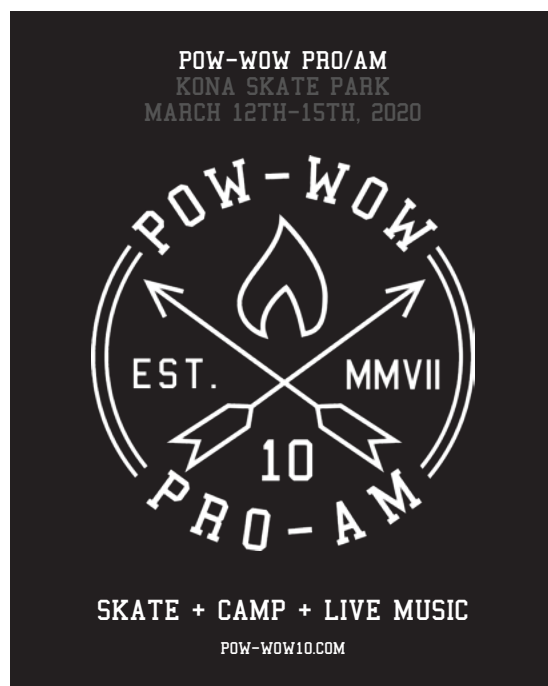
What do you have planned for the 10th year?

Rohna – 'The Beautiful Ordinary'

Tampa four-piece Rohna are a rock n' roll chimera. They're measured, and they're brash; sensual, but fun. Picture a salsa club on punk night, or a jazz band possessed by the Allman brothers. Better yet, picture ten tracks and infinite replays of Rohna's harmonic brand of chaos on 'Beautiful Ordinary'. True to its name, it isn't any sort of complicated album, but it's catchy, consistent, and at times, captivating. Hypnotizing stretches of jazzy riff-raff blend with velvet vocals and hip-bobbing beats. 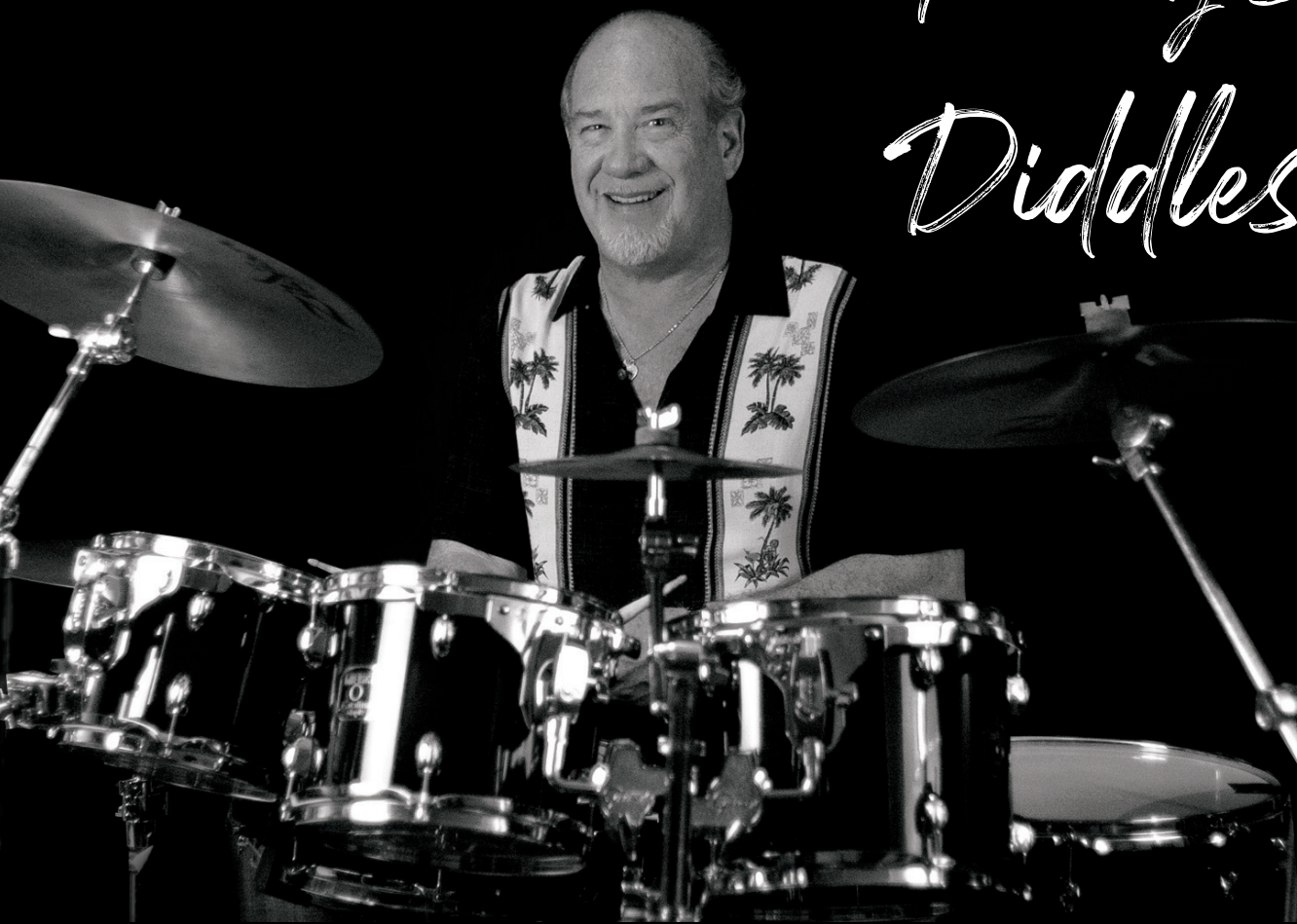

WAXED – 'Butterflies Garden'

Breezy, bright, and groovy, 'Butterflies Garden' may seem like the perfect antidote to your new-decade doldrums, but it's not without a few demons of its own. In fact, Waxed seems to revel in them, making wonder out of woe and turning gloom into stylish, soft-focus pop. With whip-smart lyrics, ghostly vocals, and a relentless rhythm section, Waxed takes the familiar dream-pop formula and gives it some much needed bravado. With equal parts nostalgia and nuance, the majority of their songs plays like ephemeral John Hughes montages – some tracks are intriguing and legitimately arresting, while others are fun. INTERVIEW WITH BEN ROSENBLUM (PIANO)

Last month I learned that the **Ben Rosenblum Trio** /// **@benrosenblummusic** would be performing **Wednesday, January 29th at the Blue Bamboo Art Center**, and since SIGT is always looking to share insights on emerging talent, I thought it would be really cool to interview Ben prior to his upcoming Winter Park performance.

As I discovered when listening to several of his albums, this young man is a super talented musician. Ben is also a graduate of the Columbia/Juilliard School of Music in NYC. He has studied piano with some very amazing pianists during his school days and it shows—or should I say, “It sure sounds it!”

Ben loves to share his musical talent and love of Jazz. He seems truly inspired. Interestingly, I caught myself thanking Ben multiple times for his commitment to Jazz and carrying the torch for a genre that is so important to music globally, yet continues to be extremely challenging commercially for the noble men and women who endeavor. It has been observed by many in “The Biz” that Rosenblum is mature beyond his years. Well, now I can attest that this is true both musically and as a human being.

So, we kicked off a phone interview ...



So Ben, you graduated from Juilliard and jumped right into full-time performance. How would you say you have grown musically?

Once out of school, I really started to book more shows as a leader. I realized on our first long tour that you need a special skill set to lead in addition to your musical ability. I knew I had the tools, but I had to figure out how to put them all together to my advantage and the benefit of my band. This meant being sure that the players were satisfied artistically and keeping the music fresh for the audience. I've started digging deeper into the repertoire and adding more familiar or modern melodies and songs but arranged with our signature interpretation. Think like contemporary film soundtracks.

What do you love about Jazz compared to other genres? Did you listen to your dad's collection of vinyl and CDs?

Well yeah, but actually it was my mom's music collection that was really Jazz-based.

Since you mentioned interpreting movie score themes and video game melodies, have you considered re-stylizing any music of the last decade or even the '90s like the Seattle Grunge music scene?

Oh yeah, not yet. But it's all there. There are so many things that I love. But right now, the only thing close is a Neil Young song, "Philadelphia." Really beautiful.

That's from the film soundtrack by the same name, correct? It's quite beautiful.

Yes.

You have covered compositions by some of the greats of Jazz such as Oscar Peterson and Bill Strahan.. Who would you say are two of your major influences?

I had the privilege to take only one lesson with the great Kenny Barron. It was only one session, but so surreal and just inspired me. I felt like I was playing much of the same vocabulary as Kenny but he was just so much better. It was this kind of moment where I realized I had to figure out some kind of essence and, you know, phrasing and accents and articulations. Something that isn't coming out of him that was just not in my playing. So I started listening to a lot of his recordings. One in particular was a solo album 'Live at Maybeck'. I listened to this album so much that when I improve on an F Blues, it's

stuff straight out of his versions on that record. Kenny is a huge influence. Another person (piano) is Hank Jones, who has worked with my favorite Jazz singer, Abbey Lincoln. If I could accompany a singer like Abbey I would be completely happy.

What about future projects? Do you see yourself possibly accompanying a vocalist?

Yeah, you know, somebody I learned a lot from (and has played with everybody) is Deborah DitaBash. When I was about 18, my teacher was Roy Asoff (kinda unknown but great) who is not even playing music anymore but taught me everything. Roy asked me to help learn tunes with her. Deborah was in her mid 50s at the time and had played with Kenny Barron and Tommy Flannigan. We became fast friends and last year we performed in Beijing together—my first time in China and just incredible. Honestly, most of the tunes (standards) I know, Deborah taught me.

That's awesome. Have DitaBash and you recorded anything? Are there other singers you work with?

Thanks. No, we have not yet recorded together. There are a few other Jazz singers I have worked with which are mostly into the World music scene.

I heard or read is that one of your recording approaches is to do a whole set like you would play at a show as one take. Is that approach about capturing a certain spontaneity?

Yes absolutely. We've done 3 albums and that's what we did for the second album, 'River City.' We got closer to the live energy. Tried to avoid the mindset of, "Oh, we can always do another take." At a show there's no take two. We took a track-by-track approach on the third and newest album. I was under more time constraints and that made more sense. Had to schedule it out since we had a lot of guests on the album. People coming and going so...I had all the track thought out very carefully. For that reason.

You're a New Yorker. How would you say being from New York and living there influences your music?

Oh yeah, a great question. I talk about this when I do master classes and I always suggest that you should come up to NYC even if just for a year or two if you can. You'll be surrounded by people/

musicians who are better than you all the time. I find I'm constantly meeting musicians I didn't know on gigs almost every week, which is insane to me because I've been living here for twenty six years. And they all really sound great. Lastly, I find that musicians that have lived in NYC awhile play with a certain intensity I don't always find in other cities. Even when playing quietly and delicately, there's this rhythmic drive and underpinning the New York players all seem to have. They're always pushing the music forward and keeping the feel where it should be.

What music will you focus on for your 2020 gigs? Is it to promote your latest album or whatever the mood strikes?

Actually, the set list will consist of songs from all of the last albums. But the goal is to continue to have a presence. Just play what we think works and feels good.

What's the story behind the River City track? I understand that might have something to do with Jacksonville, Florida.

Well yes. I was in JAX for a competition when I wrote it. We were staying at a hotel that was next to the blue draw bridge that crosses the St. Johns. I would walk over that bridge to calm my anxiety about the competition. I thought it was a beautiful little oasis in the middle of a city. I thought about the parallels of growing up near the water in NYC and how it brings a certain peacefulness in an otherwise chaotic urban environment.

Do you travel with a back line (drums, upright bass)?

Yes when we can. Especially on the East Coast. Our bassist is very excited to have his own instrument on our upcoming tour. Fortunately, The Blue Bamboo has a beautiful piano and I'm looking forward to playing it.

Well that's very cool. Did you know the St. Johns River runs south to north and its headwaters are not too far from Orlando?

Really? No, I did not. That's really cool. I guess that would have been nice to know when writing River City.

I think you would really enjoy cruising the St. Johns from Central Florida to Jacksonville. Maybe plan to do that on your next swing through Florida. So, I will see you on the 29th. Till then, safe travels! Thanks!
